
Fast Fashion and its impact on the Environment.

Fast Fashion is the mass production of clothing that is cheap and disposable. It encourages people to buy more clothes because they are so cheap and fashion trends keep changing.

Did you Know?

The Fashion industry is the second biggest cause of pollution in the world.

The production of fast fashion clothes uses toxic chemicals, dangerous dyes and synthetic fabrics that seep into water supplies. It is a huge cause of water pollution.



What can you do?

- ❖ Reuse your old clothes. Turn them into something new.
- ❖ Donate old clothes.
- ❖ Sell your clothes second-hand
- ❖ Buy less clothes.
- ❖ Buy clothes made from natural fibres.
- ❖ Buy clothes made in Ireland to avoid the pollution caused by air travel.
- ❖ Buy clothes made in countries that have stricter environmental laws and more rights for workers.

Clothing Facts.

- 80 billion garments are produced each year.
- 400% more clothes are produced now compared to 20 years ago
- 7 times is the average amount of times a garment is worn before being thrown away
- Only 20% to 30% of the clothes in most women's wardrobes are being worn!



The Fashion industry also uses a huge amount of water. **20,000** litres of water are needed to produce just **1kg** of cotton. **1500** litres of water is used to make one pair of jeans!



When we wash a synthetic garment, plastic microfibres are released into the water, which makes its way into our oceans. Synthetic fibres are non-biodegradable. This means they can take up to **200 years** to decompose.

The majority of textiles made for fast fashion companies are made in developing Asian countries such as [Bangladesh](#), [Vietnam](#) and [Indonesia](#). These countries have less strict environmental regulations and labour laws.

Fast fashion companies can mass produce clothing without legal consequences because of this lack of rules and regulations. The companies tend to get away with things like unlawful child labour and terrible working conditions.

Workers are expected to work 60-140 hours a week! They get no breaks and they are not paid for working overtime. Pregnant workers are refused maternity leave and are often fired.





In 2013, an 8-floor building housing garment factories in Dhaka, Bangladesh collapsed. Over 2500 workers were injured, and 1,134 were killed


Toxic water


